

# Assignments for students needed by HU

### Business, IT & Management Data Semester assignments, HBO-ICT year 2, start Feb 2023:

The HU is looking for authentic assignments for their second-year BIM students (Business, IT & Management) Data Semester projects. These are projects focusing on Data and its added value to the organisation. Five students work together in a project group for and with a client. The client assumes the role of product owner vis-à-vis the project group. Students work Scrum-wise for a semester. Students work full time on the project. They are supported by coaches and experts from Utrecht University of Applied Sciences. Students mostly work at school, but we expect them to work one day a week at the client's site partly under supervision (think of 4 hours of supervision from the client per week). In addition, students have to achieve their learning outcomes in the projects, which means we set requirements for the assignments. The assignment largely determines the student's learning.

### Innovation assignments, HBO-ICT year 3 start Feb 2023:

We are looking for authentic assignments for our third-year Innovation Semester. In these multidisciplinary projects, students work together from the majors:

- Artificial Intelligence,
- Business IT and Management,
- Cyber Security and Cloud,
- Software Development
- Technical Computer Science.

The projects are multidisciplinary, 5-6 students from the above disciplines or roles work together in a project group for and with a client. The assignment determines the mix of student roles in the project. The client assumes the role of product owner vis-à-vis the project group. Students work Scrum-wise for a semester. In addition, students have to achieve their learning outcomes in the projects, which means we have assignment requirements. Besides good attitude and commitment, we like to see the following topics or themes reflected in the assignments.

### The IIBA event calendar 2023


